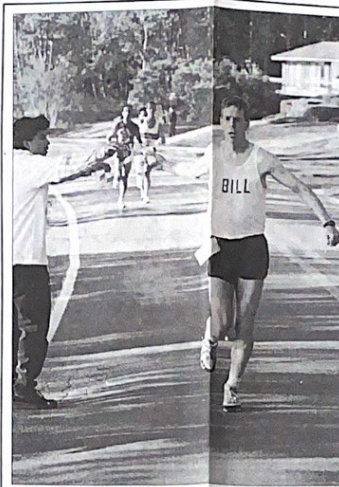

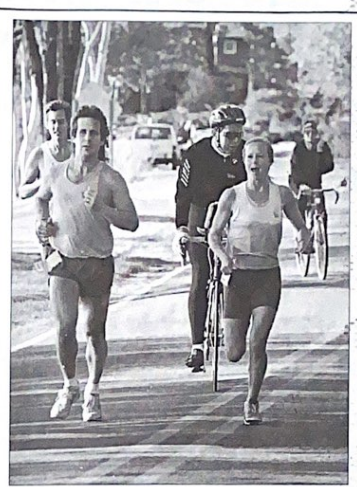

# Hoezee, Newbury capture Bayshore 10K

TRaverse City — Something old, something new. The Bayshore 10-kilometer running race had a touch of both Saturday.

The old, Don Hoezee made it six victories in six years as he claimed the men's race in 31:39 — more than two minutes ahead of runner-up Paul Foster.

The new, Vicki Newbury, in her first Bayshore race, took the women's 6.2-mile event in 39:22.

Ironically, Hoezee and Newbury were both 5K winners at the Meekix Mushroom Festival earlier this month.

That was Hoezee's last race prior to Saturday. He hurt himself on a training run shortly after the Mushroom Festival.

"Up until last week, I didn't know if I'd be able to run this thing," Hoezee said. "I had a call injury. I love to do a lot of cross-country running and during one outing I stepped in a pothole. I took six days off."

"But this last week I felt strong. I cranked out some good miles, so I figured I'd give it a shot. I knew I wasn't in shape to run in the low 30s, but I figured I could break 32. I'm pretty pleased with it."

The 28-year-old Elk Rapids resident spent a restless Friday night thinking about the race.

"I didn't sleep at all (Friday)," he said. "I was thinking about how the race was going to go today. You can get some pretty good runners here."

Hoezee didn't have to worry, though. He took control one mile into the race.

"Of the six winners, this was probably the easiest," he said. "I wanted to go out and run closed to five-minute miles."

"When you're running by yourself, though, it makes a difference. It's not like you're running against yourself and there's nobody there to push you to the limit. You have to psyche yourself up and really concentrate on what you're doing."

"If you're just out there for fun, it's different," he added. "But if you're out there for three miles, that's when you have to dig down and concentrate on your breathing, on your pace."

"I started off with Don for the first mile, but that was just to see where I was at and to have a little fun," he said.

Newbury, who just moved to Traverse City last week from North Springs, 19, no stranger to the victory circle. But it's usually cross-country skiing she dominates.

"I run to keep in shape for skiing," she said. "Skiing is the sport I really love."

The Bayshore was the second race of the season for the 25-year-old Newbury.

"I ran the first half pretty relaxed," she said. "Then I tried to push it the second half."
